
FOOD SECTOR

INSTITUTIONAL INVESTORS


- Can contribute to the sustainable development

1. RESPONSIBLE INVESTMENT

- Responsible Investment (RI) acknowledges Environmental, Social and Governance factors (ESG)
- Through RI investors want to
 - optimize the risk-return performance
 - influence on societal and environmental issues
 - manage funds in a way that is consistent with their values



2. INSTITUTIONAL INVESTORS


- Focus on pension funds and asset managers:
 - major sources of fresh capital to the global food and agriculture sector
 - committed to The United Nations supported Principles for Responsible Investment (UN PRI)
 - biggest owners
 - fiduciary duty:
 - obligations exist to ensure that those who manage other people's money act responsibly in the interests of savers



3. ESG ISSUES IN FOOD SECTOR

ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES

- Climate change
- Biodiversity loss
- Emissions (air, soil, water)
- Excess use of nutrients, pesticides, chemicals
 - Unsustainable resource, land and water use
 - Animal keeping



SOCIAL ISSUES


• Violations of health, safety and labor standards and


