

Esa R. Korpi, MD, PhD, is professor of pharmacology at the Institute of Biomedicine, University of Helsinki, Finland. He served as the director of the Institute from 2004 to 2013.

He got his MD and PhD degrees at the University of Tampere (both 1980), did his postdoc period at St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Adult Psychiatry Branch, NIMH, Washington DC, 1981-1983, and worked as a researcher at the Research Laboratories of the Finnish State Alcohol Co. Alko Ltd 1984-1996. Thereafter, he acted as the professor of pharmacology at the University of Turku 1996-2002. He has spent sabbaticals at the Center of Molecular Biology, University of Heidelberg, Germany 1991-1992, at the University of Mainz, Germany 2000-2001, and made shorter research visits at the Vanderbilt University Nashville TN and NIAAA Rockville MD USA 2000-2002. He was a visiting professor at the National University of Singapore in 2014.

He has been the chairman of the Brain Research Society of Finland 2000-2002 and the Drug Research Foundation 2006-2008, and a member of the Finnish Academy of Science and Letters since 2007.

He has published over 270 original articles and reviews in the fields of neuropsychopharmacology, biomedical alcohol research, neurobiology of addiction and brain diseases.
